# **COVID STATEMENT**

In the 2019-2020 school year, American Heritage ceased in-person instruction on 3/13/20 and transitioned to a distance learning plan on 3/30/20 which included a combination of posted assignments, videos, and live digital classes (using Google Meet).

Students attended live 45-minute virtual classes every Tuesday and Thursday from 8:00 AM - 3:00 PM. Academic support, enrichment activities and student collaboration took place virtually on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Heritage uses a quarter grading system to calculate semester grades. Students were able to complete Q1-Q3 prior to transitioning to distance learning. Semester 2 was calculated by averaging Q3 and Q4. No Semester 2 exam was given, and Semester 2 has been factored into the overall GPA.

For the 2020-2021 academic year, the school plans continue to have in-person instruction five days a week with a concurrent distance learning option. Distance learning students will be attending in-person class via a web platform and are expected to be active participants.

The high school, grades 9-12, has a student population of 990 students. Our student to faculty ratio is 5:1. American Heritage School is a tuition-only school where, in an effort to make all families equal, we do not ask for nor accept donations. We are completely managed by veteran educators, and we have no governing board. It is paramount that all our staff have a vested interest in American Heritage, therefore, faculty and staff children receive full tuition to our school.

#### A College Prep Experience

Our school resembles a small college in size and design with facilities and labs similar to those on a college campus. American Heritage School gives its students a rigorous, traditional education in a forward-thinking, technologically advanced, well-rounded environment. Our elite students, 100% of whom are accepted into 4- year universities, are uniquely prepared to be leaders of the 21st century, who embody knowledge, integrity, and compassion. To this end, we strive to offer a challenging college preparatory curriculum serving students of bright average to gifted intelligence and aim to develop critical thinking skills, problem solving abilities, and lifelong learning. #### GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

There are two (2) semesters per year and credits are granted at the end of each semester. In addition, all students are required to complete 120 hours of community service. All classes are 50 minutes long and meet five (5) times each week. To graduate, a student must have earned a total of 24 credits (Carnegie units). The graduation requirements are as follows:

- English: 4 credits (one per year to Fine Arts: 0.5 credit include World, American, British)
- Math: 4 credits
- **Science**: 3 credits including Biology, Chemistry or Physics (4 recommended)
- Social Studies: 3 credits including World History, American History, Economics, American Government
- Foreign Language: 2 credits (two consecutive years of the same foreign language)
- (one semester of drama, art or music)
- Physical Education: 0.5 credit (one semester)
- Electives: 7 credits (four electives should be in the first five subject areas listed above)
